This is really important as this week there was a near miss where a delivery vehicle came around the corner where a car was parked with the doors open and a lady helping her children from the car. By chance, there was no traffic coming the other way and so the driver was able to swerve to avoid the car/pedestrians, but this could equally have resulted in a serious injury, especially if it had been one of the delivery lorries which would not have been able to avoid the car!





INTERNET SAFETY



Behind videosharing platforms (like YouTube) and streaming TV shows and movies, gaming is the third most popular online activity for children in the UK. In fact, according to recent data from Ofcom, an overwhelming 89% of children aged 3 to 17 play video

games. Of those, more than one in five (22%) talk to other players online who they don't know outside the game.

The risk of contact from strangers is just one of the reasons that many parents are concerned about their child's gaming: increased screen time, inappropriate content and in-game spending also figure among the most frequent fears. Agreeing on some rules around your child's gaming activities can certainly help, and our guide has some useful tips for establishing these boundaries.
